Dear Fr. Wister,

Upon information and belief, the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith and the Holy Father want me to correct the Catholic Church in the United States for errors concerning the authenticity of the Shroud of Turin (<http://www.dkroemer.com>), scientific arguments for God's existence (<http://www.newevangelist.me>), and evolutionary biology (<http://www.pseudoscience123.com>).

In connection with this mission, I recently had an insight into what would cause educated Catholics to think the scientific arguments for God's existence are persuasive and I wanted to share this insight with Catholic theologians. My request was ignored by the theologians at Fordham, St. John's, Seton Hall, and Georgetown. I then wrote an essay titled "Why People Believe God Caused the Big Bang" and submitted it to the Journal of the American Academy of Religion, which rejected it. It was also rejected by The Thomist, and I recently submitted it to the Review of Metaphysics.

I want to explain my insight to theologians in the New York area. With all due respect, I want to remind you that you have a duty to assist the Magisterium. I discussed this matter with Fr. Ciccarino on the telephone.
