I'm looking through it to explain why your entry on the "cosmological-argument" is very misleading because it leaves out the rational argument for God's existence based on the metaphysics of Thomas Aguinas.

In the book, Clarke referred to his own article: "A curious Blind-Spot on the Anglo-American Tradition of Anti-Theistic Argument," Monist 54 (1970), p. 181 to 200.
